

Architecture guidelines based on:

- interest and need expressed by local governments and community

- Purpose of the guidelines:

- maintain the unique identity of the region
- offer a reference material for contemporary builders
- offer a reference material for local municipalities and architects responsible for building and construction in coastal areas



Writing process:

- identify local architectural traditions in cooperation with acrhitectural heritage specialists


Writing process:

-discussions with local residents – how they want to see their living environment.



Writing process:

- consultation with professional architects and builders on how to integrate traditional elements in contemporary building



Contents of the guideline document – draft version:

1. Survey of the coastal architectural heritage:

Homesteads and villages, the principles of forming yards, architectural forms of buildings, building materials, finishing materials, traditional architectural elements, small architecture forms.

2. Basic concepts of building construction in coastal areas respecting the historical continuity

3. Development of common infrastructure

4. New building constructions:

Planning the land plots, height of buildings, arranging constructions in the yard (distances between buildings), facades, roofing, colors, finishing materials, fencing, small architecture forms, recreational areas, etc.....
