Akmeņi Nature Resort is an eco-friendly guesthouse that integrates renewable energy solutions and sustainable practices in its hospitality business. Followed by a visit to **Turkalne Manor**, where **local craft cider** production supports the restoration of a historic manor.

Tour of Akmeni Nature Resort (eco-friendly initiatives & sustainability practices)

The resort near the Daugava River offers fully equipped cottages, each with its own sauna and hot tub, providing guests with the perfect way to unwind after a day of exploring the surrounding area's natural beauty, including walking and cycling trails. The resort has been awarded the Green Certificate eco-label for sustainable management. Its energy solutions include solar panels and a wind turbine. An e-mobile is used for transport within the resort, and guests can enjoy boating trips on the River Daugava in e-boats. Electric vehicle charging points are available for guests. The buildings feature heat recovery and air conditioning systems, while an automated water treatment and irrigation system maintains the garden.

Turkalne Manor, established in 1604, is a place where history meets modern technology through the renovation of the manor and the production of craft beverages. The manor produces apple cider, apple-rhubarb cider, mulled cider, beer, and wine, using apples and berries from local fruit and berry farms. The current owner acquired the property in 2014 as an abandoned building near his holiday complex and began renovating it to save it from decay. His first project was restoring the manor's barn, which now offers visitors insight into its history, along with tastings of its produce. The barn's second floor features a spacious venue for weddings, family celebrations, seminars, and training sessions. The future plans include continuing the restoration of the manor buildings, improving the grounds, and expanding beverage production by dedicating a separate building for the production of each beverage, complete with tasting rooms.

The Chef's House is located in the former Līgatne Maternity Hospital, built in 1897 by the owner of the Līgatne Paper Mill for his workers' families. Today, it serves as both a restaurant and a creative space for chefs and food enthusiasts to experiment and craft innovative dishes using local, wild, and seasonal ingredients. The concept was developed by Ēriks Dreibants, one of Latvia's top chefs and a nature lover. This connection to nature is reflected in the area surrounding the restaurant, which features a Nature Observers' Garden, a Bird Watching Square, and a Butterfly Meadow, alongside a herb garden, fruit trees, and berry bushes. Listed in the Michelin Guide Latvia 2025, it holds the prestigious Michelin Green Star, awarded to establishments that lead the way in sustainable gastronomy.

This nature experience takes you to the Great Kemeri Bog, one of the largest raised bogs in Latvia, featuring a distinctive landscape of small lakes, low pine trees and deep pools. This protected nature site in Kemeri National Park is an extensive hydrological system, a preserver of the local microclimate, and a major source of sulphurous water. It is also an important bird habitat. During this expedition with one of Latvia's most experienced bog guides, you will discover many fascinating facts about the nature, origin, flora, and fauna of bogs. Walking in bogs with bog shoes provides access to areas that would otherwise be difficult or even impossible to reach on foot. Bog-shoeing requires no special knowledge or skills.

N.B.! Rubber boots are provided, but you may choose to use your own waterproof shoes (trekking shoes or rubber boots). In case of rain, choose a waterproof windbreaker, do not take umbrellas with you. Dress in layers which can be added or removed based on weather conditions and activity, if needed.

We will walk 5 km along the Baltic Coastal Hiking Trail, starting from the historic fishing village of Ragaciems and ending at the restaurant Neptūns for lunch.

The Baltic Coastal Hiking Trail runs along the shores of the Baltic Sea in Latvia, Lithuania, and Estonia, and is part of the **E9 route in the European network** of long-distance hiking paths. The E9 route begins at Cape St. Vincent in Portugal and ends in Tallinn, the capital of Estonia. The Coastal Hiking Trail is divided into approximately 20 km sections, designed for one- or two-day hikes, with accommodation and transport options available. We will enjoy a hike along part of section #21, which runs through Kemeri National Park along a sandy beach. Along the way, hikers can observe dune habitats and enjoy birdwatching.

Built in 1968, the restaurant has preserved its original architecture and interior design, maintaining the character of that era for historical reminiscence. The restaurant menu is largely based on locally sourced ingredients.

The business holds the national Green Certificate ecolabel, recognizing its environmentally friendly practices. Situated near the Coastal Hiking Trail the restaurant proudly displays the Hiker-Friendly sign, welcoming hikers. Additionally, the owners operate a small-scale camping site not far from the restaurant.

Visit to Caunītes Country House: Bread Baking and Carpentry Experiences

The Rubenis family keeps **traditional crafts alive**, offering hands-on masterclasses and programs for visitors to experience these skills as part of their modern lifestyle. The homestead's heart is a barn with a bread-baking stove, where the hostess bakes "salinātā" rye bread—a Traditional Speciality Guaranteed (TSG) product recognized by the EU for using traditional methods. The host's passion for woodcraft combines ancient and modern techniques to create beautiful, functional wooden pieces. This tourism business has earned the Green Certificate for preserving heritage and managing the property sustainably. The family works with nature experts to organize tours, sharing insights into the local forest and meadow biodiversity.
